West Region, Mississauga, Streetsville & Port Credit

Location: Broadly speaking, when south of Davenport Road, west of Bathurst Street, and when north of Davenport Road, west of Yonge Street, and continuing west past Lester B. Pearson Airport

This area not only features distinct neighbourhoods and destinations, it's seamlessly linked to downtown's public transit and highways, and includes Mississauga, Canada's sixth-largest and fastest-growing city.

West Toronto rewards you with plenty of engaging and entertaining options, including historic places for tea, such as the Old Mill Inn and Montgomery's Inn. Use Bloor Street and Dundas Avenue West as your guide and explore a dazzling assortment of shops and cafés that subtly take on the charm of their surroundings and resident cultures. Bargain hunters rejoice at Dixie Outlet Mall, Dr. Flea's and Fantastic Flea Market, while style mavens enjoy a selection of malls, including Ontario's largest. The area surrounding Lester B.
